## WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP



The TriSonics complete their season with 6 Blue BANNERS!

On April 26 - 28, the TriSonics competed at the World Championship hosted in Detroit, MI. It was the first year to be hosted here in our home state, and it was an incredible event. After three days of hard competition the TriSonics climbed the rankings and placed #4 at the end of qualification matches. They had a win/loss record of 9/1, and were picked by the #3 alliance captain on the Archimedes sub-division field. The TriSonics also ended up taking home the Autonomous Award sponsored by Ford. This is the first year that they gave away this award, and it was only at the World Championship. This award was only given out to 6 teams so far, and the TriSonics were honored to be one of those select few.

## Day 1

On Thursday, qualification matches began at the Cobo Center in Detroit and the TriSonics finished the day ranked #2 in the Ford Division with a record of 4-0. A total of 405 teams competed, which are divided into 6 divisions. To unwind, the TriSonics went to Ford Field for an all FIRST robotics team welcome party.

## Day 2

On Friday, after 114 qualification matches were completed, the TriSonics finished the competition ranked #4 out of 68 teams in the Archimedes Division. The TriSonics had a record of 5-1 for the day, and an overall 9-1 record, which is pretty impressive at the World Championship! With alliance selections on Saturday morning, the TriSonics were able to have some time at the hotel to go through their scouting data and create a pick list with lots of time for discussion.

## Day 3

Saturday started with an incredible honor for the TriSonics. They won the Autonomous Award sponsored by Ford. This is the first year that this award was given out and there were only 6 teams this year who would receive it. Then, the TriSonics ended up getting selected by the #3 alliance captain, team 868, the TechHounds from Carmel, Indiana. The other 2 teams on their alliance were team 4541, the CAV-ineers and team 5422, Stormgears FRC. They ended up winning their division, and going onto play on Einstein. Einstein is a round robin tournament against the other sub-division winners. The TriSonics ended up getting knocked out with a 2-3 record.
